Congregational Prayer

O Father Eternal, O loving and gracious God, we come before You in thanksgiving for the creation around us that produces such plentiful and nourishing fruit for our sustenance and physical growth. You alone are the source of every good gift. Your hand, O Lord, created all of nature.

We thank You, O Lord, for Your generous outpouring of gifts to human life.

But we know, Lord, that man cannot live on bread alone. There is a spiritual hunger in this world that goes far beyond the belly, and there is a spiritual thirst that needs to be guenched .The harvest is abundant, Lord, and the people around us who are unchurched and unbelieving are plentiful. In this city, Lord, there are many who need to know You and Your love for them.

Open our eyes to see the harvest, Lord, Open our eyes

Give us the expectancy and hopefulness of Christ as we look at the community around us. We need the eyes of Christ to see the lostness around us and the compassion of Christ to feel love for those who are lost.

Send us, O Lord, into the fields. Send us.

There is an immediacy to the harvest of the fields. Unharvested grain will spoil. The unloved and untaught will be lost, as well.
