Congregational Prayer

O listening God, O God Who is our Refuge, hear our prayer today as we come to You with praise and adoration for the power and glory You display each day in our lives. With David, we proclaim, "O Lord, our Lord, how majestic is Your name in all the earth!" Your power is without comparison, and Your will is perfect in our lives.

O Lord, how majestic is Your name in all the earth! How absolute is Your power!

Despite our acknowledgment of Your majesty, O God, we sometimes try to run away from You and Your will for our lives. Like Jonah, we attempt to use our human judgements and prejudices to make our own decisions about ourselves and about others. We begin to believe that our will supersedes Your will, and we think we can go our own way. But storms inevitably strike when we think this way, and we are left on a deeply troubled sea of conflict, trouble, and worry.

O Jesus, Who called out, "Peace! Be still!", we pray that You save us from the storms in our lives, as well, even when we are the ones who create them.

Like Jonah, we sometimes find ourselves in the belly of the whale-- in the darkness and depths of sure destruction. We struggle for air; we are being swallowed by our grief, our sadness, our despair, our obstinance. We often feel there is no solution to our plight. Despite our disobedience, send Your Holy Spirit to inspire us to pray, to seek You out, to find You and know that You are near.

Listen to the sounds of our cries, O Father Eternal, for to You we pray for help.

Father, help us acknowledge our fault and failures. O Lord, help us remember that even in the most difficult times, You are the only source of support and guidance. Turn our hearts to You and You alone and humble us to ask for wisdom that is far beyond human capability. Convince us, Lord, that You are, indeed, more powerful than we are. Persuade us, Lord, that You know better than we do.

Lord, lead us in Your righteousness and make Your way straight before us.

We may lose sight of You, O God, but You never lose sight of us. You show us the way back to You and back to a peace that we cannot have without You. We seek You, Father, in every thought and prayer that we ask in the name of Your dear Son, Who taught us to pray:
